

How to make Origami Seed Envelopes

Seed saving or seed swapping, these dinky home made envelopes are just the job.


Hand-eye coordination may be put to the test, but a very satisfying hour on a rainy evening can be enjoyed in their manufacture.

Be creative and colourful using paper from old seed catalogues, parcel wrap, whatever!



You need

Square piece of paper: 6" x 6" is our chosen size



6 steps to seed saving envelopes

Step 1

Number each corner of the square 1 to 4, moving clockwise.

Step 2 Fold 'a' over to mad

Fold '3' over to meet '1'.

Step 3

Number each corner of your triangle 1 to 3. Fold '3' over to half way between corners '1' and '2'.

Step 4

Fold '1' over to half way between corners '2' and '3'.

Step 5

Fold '2' forwards leaving '1' of the original square behind. Tuck '2' in the uppermost triangular pocket.

Step 6

Insert seeds and tuck '1' of the original square over.
